QUAY	noun [countable], /ki:/: a hard surface next to a sea or river, where boats can stop
THIMBER	noun, /ˈtɪmbə(r)/: [uncountable] : wood used for building houses or making furniture
THRIVE	verb [intransitive]/θraɪv/: to become very successful, happy, or healthy
SQUAWKING	Verb [intransitive],/skwɔːk/: when a bird squawks, it makes a loud unpleasant noise in its throat
LINO	Noun (uncountable), /lɪˈnəʊliəm/: a hard flat substance with a shiny surface used for covering floors
BAWLING	Verb [intransitive/transitive], /bɔːl/: to shout in a loud angry way
FLEDGLING	Noun (countable), /'fledʒlɪŋ/: a young bird that has just learnt to fly
HOARSE	Adjective,/hɔː(r)s/: someone who is hoarse or has a hoarse voice speaks in a low rough voice, usually because their throat is sore
MORTAR	Noun (uncountable) /'mɔx(r)tə(r)/: a substance used in building for joining bricks or stones, made by mixing together sand, water, and lime
POMEGRANATE	Noun (countable), /'pɒmɪˌgrænət/: a round fruit that has a hard skin and many thick seeds inside
STETHOSCOPE	Noun (countable), /'steθəˌskəʊp/: a piece of equipment used by doctors for listening to someone's heart or breathing
