

<b>QUAY</b>	noun [countable], /ki:/ : a hard surface next to a sea or river, where boats can stop
<b>THIMBER</b>	noun, /'tɪmbə(r)/: [uncountable] : wood used for building houses or making furniture
<b>THRIVE</b>	verb [intransitive]/θraɪv/: to become very successful, happy, or healthy
<b>SQUAWKING</b>	Verb [intransitive], /skwɔ:k/: when a bird squawks, it makes a loud unpleasant noise in its throat
<b>LINO</b>	Noun (uncountable), /lɪ'nəʊliəm/: a hard flat substance with a shiny surface used for covering floors
<b>BAWLING</b>	Verb [intransitive/transitive], /bɔ:l/: to shout in a loud angry way
<b>FLEDGLING</b>	Noun (countable), /'fledʒlɪŋ/: a young bird that has just learnt to fly
<b>HOARSE</b>	Adjective, /hɔ:(r)s/: someone who is hoarse or has a hoarse voice speaks in a low rough voice, usually because their throat is sore
<b>MORTAR</b>	Noun (uncountable) /'mɔ:(r)tə(r)/: a substance used in building for joining bricks or stones, made by mixing together sand, water, and lime
<b>POMEGRANATE</b>	Noun (countable), /'pɒmɪ,grænət/: a round fruit that has a hard skin and many thick seeds inside
<b>STETHOSCOPE</b>	Noun (countable), /'steθə,skəʊp/: a piece of equipment used by doctors for listening to someone's heart or breathing
